

## ***Earth Day...Every Day*** **Final Event with Amarillo Zoo and Panhandle PBS this Saturday**

The Amarillo Zoo and Panhandle PBS have been inviting families to visit the Zoo in April for a series of outdoor events aimed at helping us become better stewards of our natural world – not just during Earth Month, but all year long!

The remaining Saturday event is from 10 a.m. to noon on Saturday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>. Kids with a paying adult get in FREE, and Zoo admission for adults is only \$4 (just \$3 for seniors.)

The Amarillo Zoo is located within Thompson Park, which is at N.E. 24<sup>th</sup> Avenue and the Dumas Highway.

Activities for the April 23<sup>rd</sup> event will focus on our endangered Tigers and will include the following:

- **See a live Black-footed Ferret – considered the most endangered mammal in North America!**
- **Meet and get your picture taken with costumed characters – the Zoo's Tiger mascot, and Curious George from PBS Kids!**
- **Free Wonderland pass per family at the Panhandle PBS booth as supplies last.**
- **Get your face painted like a Tiger - \$5 donations towards Project Panthera to help restore tiger habitat**
- **10:30 a.m. - Wildlife Show**
- **11:15 a.m. - Keeper chat and enrichment activity featuring the Zoo's Bengal Tigers**
- **Children's Make-and-Take craft station**
- **Learn about how you can help save the tigers and their habitat**
- **Show your artistic side with sidewalk chalk art**
- **Watch PBS Kids Wild Kratts and Curious George programs from Panhandle PBS**

Through this event, the Amarillo Zoo and Panhandle PBS will strive to create special experiences that help children and their families explore the outdoors together, while learning about protecting the animals and habitats of our planet.
